The volume focuses on three countries - Egypt, Israel, and Turkey (earlier the Ottoman Empire) - in the period between the mid-nineteenth and the early Twenty-first-centuries. It studies the consumption of homes and domesticity as changing processes in space and time. Even more so, the volume advances the discussion on the processes of restructuring of self-identity and lifestyles via acts of consumption.
