Laotse's real name is Lao

Tan, who is great thinker and sage. In China, "Lao Tse" called "Tao Te Ching" too, as it is Laotse's only book and include his main thought. Lao Tse (Tao Te Ching) contain two parts, one part (chapter 1 to chapter 37) is Tao Ching, another part (chapter 38 to chapter 81) is Te Ching. Laotse's greatness is that his thought never constrained people's minds, and all people can learn new ideas from it and discover the essence of all things. The essence is Nature or Truth (Tao). Laotse said: When the

highest type of men hear the Tao (truth), They try hard to live in accordance with it, When the mediocre hear the Tao, They seem to be aware and yet unaware of it. When the lowest type hear of Tao, They break into loud laughter, If it were not laughed at, it would not be Tao. I am quite sure that the reaction of the majority of readers on first looking into Laotse's book will be to laugh. I say this without any disrespect, for I did that myself. The highest type of scholars end by

laughing with Laotse at the preoccupations of the philosophers of the day. After that, Laotse becomes a lifelong *The Ford of Heaven* Harcourt This is the first critical edition and generally available translation of the short allegorical comedy *Cosmarchia* by Jacob Bidermann, the best-known Jesuit dramatist. Friend of the Chiefs Silk Pagoda

Winner of the coveted China Times Novel Prize, this postmodern, first-person tale of a contemporary Taiwanese gay man reflecting on his life, loves, and intellectual influences is among the most important recent novels in Taiwan. The narrator, Xiao Shao, recollects a series of friends and lovers, as he

watches his childhood friend, Ah Yao, succumb to complications from AIDS. The brute fact of Ah Yao's death focuses Shao's simultaneously erudite and erotic reflections magnetically on the core theme of mortality. By turns humorous and despondent, the narrator struggles to come to terms with Ah Yao's risky lifestyle, radical political activism, and eventual death; the fragility of romantic love; the awesome power of eros; the solace of writing; the

cold ennui of a younger generation enthralled only by video games; and life on the edge of mainstream Taiwanese society. His feverish journey through forests of metaphor and allusion—from Fellini and Lévi-Strauss to classical Chinese poetry—serves as a litany protecting him from the ravages of time and finitude. Impressive in scope and detail, *Notes of a Desolate Man* employs the motif of its characters' marginalized sexuality to highlight Taiwan's vivid and fragile existence on

the periphery of mainland China. Howard Goldblatt and Sylvia Li-chun Lin's masterful translation brings Chu T'ien-wen's lyrical and inventive pastiche of political, poetic, and sexual desire to the English-speaking world.

Hans Bethge (1876-1946) war ein deutscher Dichter und machte sich vor allem einen Namen durch seine Nachdichtungen orientalischer Lyrik. Hans Bethge studierte neuere Sprachen und Philosophie in Halle, Erlangen und Genf. Nach der Promotion arbeitete er zwei Jahre in

Spanien als Lehrer. 1901 liess er sich als freier Schriftsteller in Berlin nieder. Bethge veröffentlichte mehrere Gedichtbände (hauptsächlich Liebes- und Naturlyrik), Tagebücher, Reiseberichte, Erzählungen, Essays und Dramen. Der erste Band *Die chinesische Flöte* (1907) erlebte eine Gesamtauflage von knapp 100.000 Exemplaren. Bethges frische, musikalisch-rhythmische Sprache und seine ungebundenen Verse

inspirierten mehr als 180 Komponisten zu Vertonungen. Weitere Werke Bethges sind: *Pfirsichblüten aus China*, *Ägyptische Reise*, *Die armenische Nachtigall*, *Omar Khayyam - Die Nachdichtungen seiner Rubai'yat* und *Arabische Nächte*. *Chinese Exile* University of Delaware Press. *A Treatise of Japaning and Varnishing* - being a complete discovery of those arts is an unchanged, high-quality reprint of the original edition of 1688.
